The mission of Llano Kitty Fixers is to reduce the number of homeless cats through humane Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR), which is the most effective and compassionate alternative to euthanasia.

Why Are So Many Cats Homeless?

Sadly, many pet cats are left homeless when people move or deliberately dump them in other neighborhoods, making them strays.

Cats that are born homeless are known as “feral”. They grow up wild, and adults cannot easily become pets since they have not had positive human contact. Feral kittens, however, can be socialized and make loving pets if caught early enough.

Why Eradication Doesn't Work

When cats are removed from an area, other unfixed cats take over their territory, just perpetuating the problem. A better option: TNR maintains each vaccinated, neutered colony as a healthy barrier between domestic and wild animals.

What We Do

People like YOU call our “cat phone” at (325) 248-7842 to alert us to homeless cats and colonies that are reproducing and may be endangered or overpopulated. We depend on the community to help us identify cats that need Trap/Neuter/Return (TNR) and to assist us in helping them.

- * LKF will assess the situation and suggest a workable solution.
- * A time will be scheduled for trapping and transport of your cats for spay/neuter.
- * Traps will be delivered and instructions given for feeding in the traps.
- * Trapping assistance will be available on trap day if needed. The cats will be taken to staging area until time for vet clinic appointment.
- * The cats will be transported to the vet clinic for spay/neuter/vaccination and then returned to the staging area.
- * Following recovery the cats will be returned to you for release.
- * When requested our volunteers will educate you, your neighbors, your organization, your school, and other groups about TNR and why it works.
